



Serene Surroundings

Designer Julie Hillman creates a calm interior space in harmony with the outdoors.


Set between a quiet pond and the Atlantic Ocean, designer Julie Hillman's latest project balances understated modern design with natural materials, custom millwork and carefully curated pieces, creating a space that feels both refined and effortless. That timeless aesthetic (mixed with an eclectic sensibility) is what New York-based Hillman has become known for, approaching residential design as a collaborative, story-driven process. "I begin by looking for a deep understanding of how my clients live and what they really want," she told *Elle Décor* in early 2025. For this particular home, Hillman set out to create a calm, light-filled retreat that felt connected to its surroundings.

Working with Stelle Lomont Rouhani Architects, Hillman oriented all eight bedrooms toward the ocean and developed a restrained palette of rift white oak, natural hardwoods, cool white Valders stone and soft plaster finishes to echo the coastal landscape. Throughout the home, collectible design and contemporary art — sourced during Hillman's travels — add depth and individuality. One standout? *The Flylight* by Studio Drift, which is suspended above the oceanfront living room. Chosen for its movement and lightness, the piece hovers delicately overhead, adding drama without obstructing sight lines and reinforcing Hillman's interest in design that feels both poetic and purposeful.
